#### THE LEGACY OF VILLA HEIGHTS BAPTIST CHURCH

We reached the point that many of our sister churches may be familiar with: we weren't the church we used to be in size, ministries, and capabilities; were an aging congregation that was having to cut back services because we didn't drive at night, cook like we used to, and becoming less physically able to get out into the community; each year the budget had to be reduced; the future looked bleaker. We had to ask the important questions: Have we completed the mission God first called us to do? Does God have someone else ready to carry our ministry forward? The members did know one thing...we did not want the building to become a funeral home or "used car lot". After much prayer and discussion, the members called upon the Trustees to explore available options so positive actions could be made to write the final chapter of Villa Heights Baptist Church, which was to continue the work of God in the community.

For 58 years, VHBC served the community as a church in the Henry County Baptist Association. It grew out of the efforts of the HCBA to put a church in every community. The charter members all lived in Villa Heights and many were former members of Associational churches. God blessed VHBC and we blessed the community.

How might God bless us and the community in the transition? The Trustees began reaching out to groups they became aware were looking for a new place to worship. Although Amanacer of Collinsville (a Hispanic church) was not at a place they could take over the property, the Trustees felt led to offer them the fellowship hall where they could worship while we continued our search. The second blessing was the discovery that Agape Bible Christian Fellowship was looking for a property and community such as ours. They had a 17 year history ministering in Martinsville/Henry County and now needed more space, especially classrooms. As discussions continued, it became clear that God was in this, and the church agreed. God now ministers to the Villa Heights community through these two congregations. The former members of VHBC have found or are seeking their place of worship in Associational or other churches.

VHBC chose to leave a final blessing to the community from the sale proceeds. Following a survey and vote, we will divide the remaining assets among Agape, Amanacer, Grace Network, the Gideon's, Pregnancy Care Center, Good News Jail Ministry, and the Horne Home's residents.
